GENERAL NOTICE OF REGISTERABLE INTERESTS

I, Adam Smith

A member of Langley Parish Council, set out below under the appropriate headings my interests, which I am required to declare under the Localism Act 2011 and the Council's Code of Conduct and I have put "none" where I have no such interests under any heading.

I recognise that it may be an offence under the Localism Act 2011 to:-

- (1) omit information that ought to be given in Section 1 this notice;
- (2) provide information in Section 1 of this notice that is materially false or misleading;
- (3) fail to give further notices in order to bring up to date information given in Section 1 of this notice after my re-election or reappointment or to fail to declare a disclosable pecuniary interest that I acquire after the date of this notice and have to declare under the provisions of s. 31 (2) Localism Act 2011.

I also acknowledge that it may be a breach of the Code of Conduct to:-

- (1) omit information that ought to be given in this notice;
- (2) provide information that is materially false or misleading;
- (3) fail to provide written notification to the authority's monitoring officer of any change in my interests contained in this notice within 28 days of my becoming aware of such change of circumstances

(Members are required to register not only their own interests under this heading but also those of their husband or wife, civil partner or of any person with whom they are living as if husband and wife or as civil partners when such interests are known by them)

6. Any tenancy where to your knowledge the landlord is the relevant authority and the tenant is a body in which the relevant person has a beneficial interest

NOTIFICATION OF A "SENSITIVE INTEREST" UNDER

SECTION 32, LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 2011

They might also include, for example, a risk of violence or intimidation if you are employed, or hold securities in a company carrying out controversial activities; e.g. life sciences.
